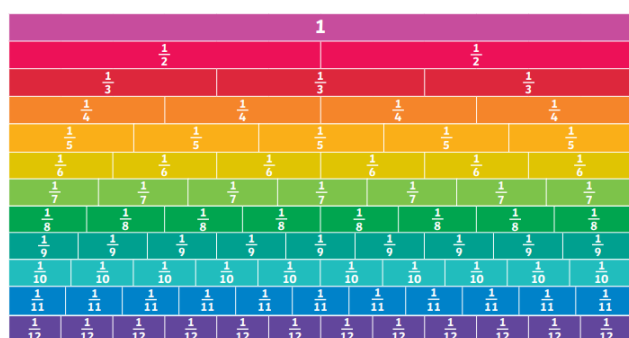

Times Tables

Recall multiplication and division facts for x3, x4 and x tables

$3 \times 1 = 3$	$4 \times 1 = 4$	$8 \times 1 = 8$
$3 \times 2 = 6$	$4 \times 2 = 8$	$8 \times 2 = 16$
$3 \times 3 = 9$	$4 \times 3 = 12$	$8 \times 3 = 24$
$3 \times 4 = 12$	$4 \times 4 = 16$	$8 \times 4 = 32$
$3 \times 5 = 15$	$4 \times 5 = 20$	$8 \times 5 = 40$
$3 \times 6 = 18$	$4 \times 6 = 24$	$8 \times 6 = 48$
$3 \times 7 = 21$	$4 \times 7 = 28$	$8 \times 7 = 56$
$3 \times 8 = 24$	$4 \times 8 = 32$	$8 \times 8 = 64$
$3 \times 9 = 27$	$4 \times 9 = 36$	$8 \times 9 = 72$
$3 \times 10 = 30$	$4 \times 10 = 40$	$8 \times 10 = 80$
$3 \times 11 = 33$	$4 \times 11 = 44$	$8 \times 11 = 88$
$3 \times 12 = 36$	$4 \times 12 = 48$	$8 \times 12 = 96$
